### Parish Nurse Notes

#### Fire Prevention Week - October 4-10, 2009



Most fire ignitions were estimated to have occurred in the first 15 minutes of cooking and in six of seven fires the cook was outside of the kitchen. Some of the most common reasons people give for kitchen fires in their house are that they forgot that something was cooking, was distracted by children, distracted by the television, or distracted by phone calls.

Some ways to reduce the risk of a fire at your house associated with cooking are:

- ✓ Regular cleaning of cooking equipment so that there are no cooking materials, food items, or grease on or around cooking equipment.
- ✓ Making sure not to overfill pots so as to reduce the risk of boil-over.
- ✓ Heating materials at the indicated temperature settings rather than at high settings, which may cook faster but may add to the risk if cooking is left unattended.
- ✓ Making sure combustibles of all kinds-rags and pot holders, curtains, bags, etc. - are kept well away from cooking surfaces.
