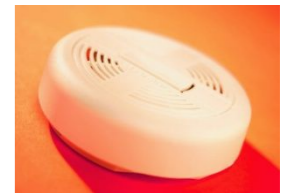

Parish Nurse Notes Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Carbon monoxide is an invisible, odorless gas that sickens 15,000 Americans each year and kills another 500. Yet fewer than 10% of people admitted to emergency rooms for carbon monoxide poisoning have detectors in their home. Early symptoms are headache, nausea, and dizziness. Carbon monoxide is produced by faulty or poorly ventilated gas and oil appliances (not electric), including furnaces and water heaters. Install a carbon monoxide detector outside all bedrooms, and follow instructions on proper installation and maintenance. Look for the Underwriters Laboratories (UL) symbol when purchasing carbon monoxide detectors.
