Pastor's Pen with Rev. kirkland Reynolds, executive pastor

St. Francis is celebrated as the patron saint of the environment and animals. A famous story about Francis recounts that "...because of the outstanding love of the Creator with which he loved all creatures, he ran swiftly to..." a great multitude of birds. "He greeted them in his usual way, as if they shared in reason." Francis invited the birds to hear the good news, saying, "My brother birds, you should greatly praise your Creator and love God always" and then went on to share Biblical teachings involving birds.

St. Francis' worship and service to God was expressed through his love for all of God's creation. Francis' preaching, even to birds, has inspired Christians for nearly 1,000 years to claim our fellowship with every living and breathing thing.

Francis also cared deeply for the poor and sick, becoming what we might call a "missionary at home" through his commitment to serve and live in solidarity with the poor.

Many have come to know St. Francis today through two developments in the church. Pope Francis choose the name Francis to communicate that his spiritual leadership follows the tradition and model of St. Francis' care for everyone, especially the poor and overlooked. In recent years, churches have started to bless pets and animals as a way to bring Francis' care of creation into the relationships we share within a congregation and into the relationships we share with animal companions at home.

A service of Blessing of the Animals is something we have done before at Christ UMC. We will gather outside, near the Field of Fun at Soldiers Field Park at 3pm on Sunday, October 17. We hope you will join us for this opportunity to bless and give thanks for, as the hymn sings, all creatures great and small.

This will be the first year in a while when I am also able to bring a pet to a Blessing of the Animals service. Though Jenny, our kids, and I have a bit of a "Noah's Ark" going on in our home - we have four pets: two cats, a hamster, and a puppy we recently adopted - it hasn't always been easy to bring our cats, who are getting up there in age, and the hamster joined us just before the start of the covid-19 pandemic. But this year we will definitely bring our puppy! She's a blessing to us, in addition to a huge infusion of energy, and we want to make sure she receives every gift of grace available.

I have always enjoyed how the Feast of St. Francis, the day in the church's calendar when we intentionally remember Francis, comes close to Halloween. This means in October we have two fun opportunities to gather outside: first for the Blessing of the Animals service and later for our annual Trunk-or-Treat event in the church parking lot.

This year is also special because Halloween falls on a Sunday. You are invited to wear your Halloween costume to church that Sunday. You may even find some treats (without any tricks!) that morning in worship.

The last time Halloween fell on a Sunday, my previous congregation also invited people to wear costumes to church. That congregation, like Christ UMC, is committed to being an inclusive community that welcomes everyone. Let me tell you, when you share the peace of Christ in worship with adults, teens, children, in addition to costumed Jedi, Elsas and Annas, Avengers, and even Pokémon, you really get an visual understanding of what it means to be a community with doors wide enough for everyone.

Whether we meet in the sanctuary, the youth room, the church parking lot, or a park, St. Francis shows us how to live our faith by showing hospitality and care for everyone, great and small.

In a message about caring for creation, St. Francis once said, "Where there is charity and wisdom, there is neither fear nor ignorance."

In this month of blessings and tricks and treats, may the blessings of God renew our commitment to sharing charity and hope rather than tolerating fear or deception.



This training is expected for new Callers, Lay Visitors and Parish Ministers. We are looking for people for each of the three forms of Caring Visitors. The teams of Caring Visitors take on different assignments and ways of connecting.

The Caller Group consists of persons who call the same list of Christ UMC members twice monthly. Callers offer Christian friendship and connection with those who are homebound.

Lay Visitors make monthly visits to offer spiritual support and connection to those who are homebound. They meet a few times a year as a group with Pastor Nancy.

Parish Ministers meet monthly with Pastor Nancy for continuing education and supervision. They make visits in hospitals (when allowed), care centers and homes as needed. They take turns being on call for visits. Application or invitation is required.

All Care Ministry Volunteers have yearly safe sanctuary training and complete background checks.

Save the date: All Saints Day will be celebrated November 7 in the worship services. We will honor members and frequent participants who have died since All Saints Day 2020. We will also honor non members whose services we have held. Family members will receive a letter of invitation.

Current COVID-19 Safety Policy



Children's Ministry Updates

Children's Ministry has many forms at Christ United Methodist Church. This Fall we launched a new season of handbells. We have many children participating in this

ministry— so many we may need to add a second group! We also have children and youth of all ages gathering for Meaningful Movement on the labyrinth from 5:30-6:00 on Wednesdays. Jody, Karla and others help children pray and play together. Peeking out the window you can see up to 25 kids dancing, spinning and building relationships with each other. A handful of children also Stay and Play from 6-7 while siblings and caregivers are in other CU Wednesday activities.

In worship on Sundays we have a special children's moment each week. We also have a children's worship bulletin for children and families - both in the worship service and watching at home— to follow along and keep the worship experience going all week.

Special events for children in October include a walk to learn about the plants and how we care for the earth at our church (October 3, 10:15am), Pumpkin Painting (October 10, 10:00am), Trunk or Treat event (October 24, set up at 3:00pm, event begins at 3:30 and runs until 5:00pm) and a family service project in early November (see more under *Mission & Service for Youth*)

Youth Ministry Updates

We have had a great September start to our youth programming.

On Wednesday nights we have Club 6-7 for our large group of 6th and 7th graders. We have met 14 unique 6th and 7th graders through this ministry. On Sundays we have youth group from 4:30-6:00. This runs from 6th-12th grade. We get some overlap with Club 6-7, but we also have youth who we see only on Sundays. We have youth who we see in worship or confirmation, but not at other events. All together we have 30+ unique youth actively involved in our church this fall. That is a great group of youth that we are supporting in faith and justice making.

Looking forward to October, we have youth group on October 3, 10 and 17 from 4:30-6:00. On October 24 we will host a trunk or treat from 3-5pm. The youth are encouraged to come at 1:30 to help get a "haunted hallway" set up. (See more about Trunk or Treat on page 3) There is NO youth group on Halloween.



Mission & Service for Youth

We have two mission opportunities coming up for youth. We plan to have a trip to ASP in summer 2022. CUMC has been sending teams to the Appalachia region for decades. These teams help make homes warmer, safer and drier because we love Jesus and want to transform

poverty. The ASP information session will be held October 17 from 4:30-6:00 in the ECC. Youth, parents and adults are highly encouraged to attend for more information and initial team building activities.

We also have a family food packing event at Feed My Starving Children on Friday November 5 from 11:30-1:00pm. Feed My Starving Children works with nonprofit partners around the world to provide consistent nutrition to schools and communities. They also provide food relief during natural disasters. This ministry does a great job of connecting our one-time service with ongoing change in the lives of children. It is a fun service project and a great way for children to be exposed to the different dimensions of justice work.

This is a no-school day for Rochester Public Schools. Families are encouraged to register and drive to Eagan together. We will have limited space and supervision for unaccompanied youth and children. Children as young as 5 are able to register with their family! Emma Norton in St Paul is a National Institution. We support them through our pledge as well as items and monies sent directly to them. Emma Norton is the only facility in the upper midwest. Iowa, however, has three!

An example of an International mission is in LaPaz, Bolivia. It is the highest capital city at 11,942 feet. Their population is around 2 million of which the majority are indigenous. The Federacion Fernenina Metodista (supported by UMW) has been providing workshops for the women for over 20 years.

The first workshops focus on confidence building and self-esteem. The women then learn how to work with wool. The women make more money, can stay home to work while taking care of their children and become confident in themselves.

Each meeting starts with an *apthapi*. As it is explained, it is like our potluck dinners. Both food and knowledge are shared and community bonds are strengthened. Doesn't that sound like our events here?

Methodism arrived in Bolivia in 1906, when missionaries arrived. At that time indigenous people were forbidden from learning to read and write. The missionaries invited the indigenous peoples to become Methodists and learn to read, write and become equal to Spanish peoples.

United Methodist Women have been involved in bettering women, youth and children for over 150 years all over the world.
