## Pastor's Pen with Rev. kirkland Reynolds, executive pastor

The other day I was stopped in my tracks when I realized how many stars dotted the sky. Well, I should say the other morning, since it was my turn to take my family's yelping Labrador Retriever puppy outside. That's life with a new puppy, and though I was tired (and to be honest: annoyed), seeing the stars in the sky changed the entire moment for me.



There were so many stars, far more than I could count. And not a cloud in the sky.

Standing there, looking up, holding my puppy's leash, I felt profoundly grateful to bear witness to those many lights in the sky. It is a gift when we awaken to the beauty around us.

Star gazing was absent among the many blessings my family previously knew in our life in the Maryland suburbs of Washington, DC. The collective luminance of street lights, house lights, and tons of other electrified lights, washed out a lot of the night sky. It was challenging to see the most common constellations, let alone the International Space Station as it passed over us.

There is so much more to see in the sky over Rochester. I am delighted by how many stars I get to see here, even with the artificial evening lights that shine around us and wash out some of the starlight in the night sky.

We are entering the season of Advent and the story of God's light coming to shine among us on Christmas. We will move through this season together, lighting candles as the dim lights at the start of our journey become brighter week by week, culminating in the dazzling brightness of a church filled with candles on Christmas Eve.

One of the messages in Advent is that God's light always shines among us.


Encouraging the church to love God by loving people, the Apostle Paul writes in Philippians 2:15 that we are to shine like stars in the sky. For us, the church at 400 5th Ave. SW in Rochester, MN, we are wise to think about how we can let our lights shine. Serving people, responding to poverty and hunger, advocating for peace with justice, sharing gifts through Christmas Anonymous, showing up when someone needs help or hope, these are good and faithful ways to shine.

The Apostle Paul would surely agree. We should note that Paul's encouragement is also directed toward how we let our lights shine in the church. We can also let light shine when we are gentle towards each other, presume grace when seeking understanding, embrace the diverse ways we respond to God's acceptance and call, and presume there's a generous smile under face masks when we see each other in meeting rooms or Zooms or in line to light a candle during worship.

We find ourselves at the threshold of a world we long to enter: where light, health, and peace are found with us and with all the world. The good news is God comes to us, showing us the way by bringing us light.

Church, in this Advent may we behold all the lights that shine among us.

The Longest Night Service is for those who recognize that this Christmas season is not a happy one. It is meant to offer hope and companionship.


There will be candle lighting, reflective prayer and music, mutual support, scripture and poetry.
