Pastor's Pen

Mighty Waters

But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream Amos 5:24



In one of our first worship services of the new year, we'll renew our baptism vows as we remember the baptism of Jesus. Don't worry- no river swims required! We'll then spend the next several weeks on a sermon series exploring stories of fish and fishing in the Bible. Which means that we have lots of water talk coming up.

Now water isn't something I usually think much in January, but it's clear that between baptism and fishing and all the outdoor activities that take place here in in the winter, I've got to get comfortable with water even when "frosty winds may moan."

But whether in snowflakes or ocean waves, I am intrigued by the idea of water both as a symbol in our faith and as a part of God's creative work in the world. Water is a sign of new life and rebirth. Water is persistent and powerful, and even as a tiny trickle, can change entire landscapes over time.

The remembrance of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday will take also place in January as we begin our sermon series. Rev. Dr. King also understood the power of water and a force that creates change over time. And he's often known for his quotation of the prophet Amos who issues a call for "justice not roll down like waters and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream".

What you may not know is that Dr. King made several trips to a small island in the Bahamas for reflection and refuge and spent many hours in the company of a fly fishing guide named Ansil Saunders. In fact, Dr. King was on a bonefishing expedition on the island just a days before his final speech and his death in Memphis, Tennessee. A 2021 short documentary called "Mighty Waters" tells the story of the friendship between these men and highlights a lesser known part of Dr. King's legacy and life. You'll hear more about this story as part of our series so be sure to join us!

It seems that water and even fishing stories are as relevant in this season as any other. We may be moving into the heart of winter but the power of water continues to draw us in. And I don't know about you, but when God calls us to the water, something sacred usually gets stirred up and let loose. I hope you'll join us this season as we find out what that might be for us this year. See you on the water-

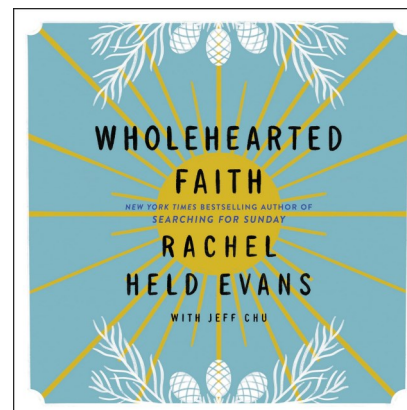
