Holy Ground

I grew up in the land of Georgia red clay. A good rainstorm turned that red clay into red mud which made for messy and wonderful art projects that never quite washed out of my clothes. In Maryland our kids also spent plenty of time creating “experiments” in the dirt, and carrying part of our yard back into the house on their hands and shoes. And now that we can finally see the ground again here in Minnesota, I find that I’m once again longing for the feel of earth between my fingers. It’s not because I’m much of a gardener (I’m not) or because I’m desperate for muddy laundry to clean, but there’s just something about dirt that embodies creativity and life.

For our Eastertide sermon series “Holy Ground”, we’ll be spending some time playing in the dirt, digging into scriptures about creation and exploring God’s call to care for and cultivate the gift of the Earth. While it’s easy to celebrate the beauty of creation, it’s equally important to recognize our part in stewarding and honoring the Earth. We are blessed by a robust Earthkeepers group here at CUMC that I know will continue to share their wisdom with us. And I’m hopeful we’ll see signs of life blooming up around us in throughout the season.

We began Ash Wednesday with a reminder that we were created from the dust of earth. On Easter Sunday we celebrated the resurrection of Jesus who raised all creation to new life. It seems fitting to continue the triumph of Easter with a reminder that God’s Holy Ground is right here among us everyday. Get your gloves and shovels and washing machines ready. It’s time to play in the dirt again!

United Women in Faith (formerly UMW)

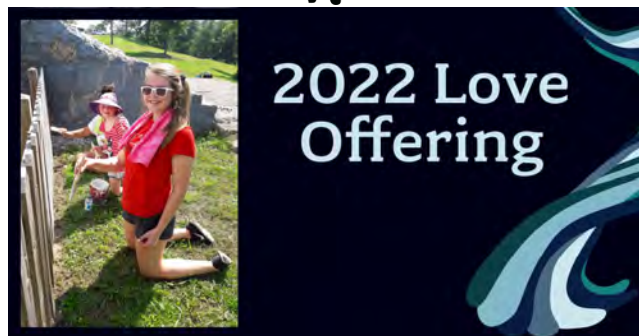

We are extremely grateful for our current relationship with Channel One, People's Food Co-op and Thrive for their weekly donations of food that enables us to provide a freshly prepared meal each week. 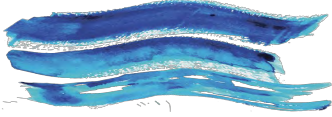

Three Rivers Restorative Justice



Respect · Accountability · Healing

TRRJ signed an agreement with the [City of Rochester, MN Police Department](#) to implement a Restorative Justice program. It will be a new tool for officers when those harmed by crime are asking for answers about what happened, reparations or help moving past the trauma experienced. TRRJ is a group of volunteer community members who have been trained through the U of MN Center for Restorative Justice and Peacemaking to facilitate Restorative Group Conferences. Since September of 2021 TRRJ has been collaborating with justice system partners in Dodge, Fillmore and Olmsted Counties to give people harmed by crime a safe space in which they can ask the person who harmed them for answers, understanding, reparations and more. The person who caused harm is given the opportunity to accept responsibility for the ripple effect of the harm they caused, show their remorse by taking steps to repair the harm and to rectify the issues that led to their poor choices.

The Rochester Police Department, like Police departments in many communities across Minnesota, is finding that in some cases, a community based resolution is the best way to achieve the goal of meeting the victim's needs, motivating the person who caused harm to desist and develop empathy and creating safe neighborhoods.

TRRJ volunteers speak of regularly seeing crime victims come away from the restorative conference with a sense of relief and questions answered. Almost unanimously they say they would recommend restorative justice to others who have been harmed by crime. National studies show that there is a 7-18% lower rate of reoffending among those who go through this process and that the cost is 75% less than the court system.
