An Introduction to We Bike Rochester by Brett Ostby

I try to bike as often as I can. Biking on our streets and paths put me closer to nature and to my neighbors. Even wearing a mask, I smell coffee roasting and flowers blooming. Biking keeps me healthy, both physically and mentally. Biking is an inexpensive activity I share with family and friends. When I use my bike to run errands, I reduce my environmental footprint and leave a parking space open for someone that really needs it.

Some years ago, I joined a grassroots group called We Bike Rochester (WBR). WBR represents a diverse community that works to normalize bicycling in Rochester. Our members have different takes on cycling, with some everyday commuters, others recreational riders, and a few identifying as athletes. We are part of a larger organization, the Bicycle Alliance of Minnesota (BikeMN).

Together WBR and BikeMN work to make our transportation networks equitable, sustainable, and safe. For example, we work with the City of Rochester to make sure our streets are designed for everyone. When streets make space for bicycles, those changes benefit those with no intention of ever getting on a bicycle. That is often misunderstood. Infrastructure enhancements for bicycles indirectly help people using wheelchairs, families with strollers, kids biking to school, and older citizens walking dogs.

It may seem counterintuitive. This is how it works. Providing space for bicycles keeps cyclists off sidewalks. This avoids conflicts with pedestrians. When streets are narrowed to provide room for protected bike lanes, automobile drivers "feel" less safe, this makes their driving behavior safer. I know that sounds strange, but bike infrastructure results in attentive driving at slower speeds. Bicycle infrastructure also makes cyclists more predictable for drivers.

Biking and buses often go together. Many of our neighbors can't afford cars and need to get to work when buses don't run or get somewhere a bus will not go. Bicycles fill that gap in our transportation system.

Josephine Van Ert is graduating from University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point.


