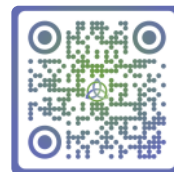

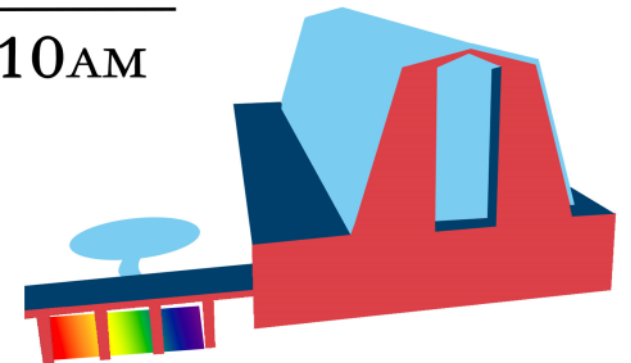


Ministry Updates:

- Our United Methodist tradition is grounded in a call to listen, pray and act with God's love in the world. In 2016, the United Methodist Church passed a resolution specifically calling on United Methodists to advocate for an end to gun violence. Today in between services, we encourage you to sign and address postcards in the Commons that advocate for senators to support two specific pieces of gun safety legislation HR 8 (The Bipartisan Background Checks Act of 2021) and HR 1446 (The Enhanced Background Checks Act of 2021) which have stalled in Congress. 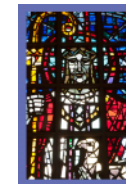
