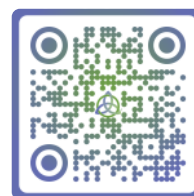



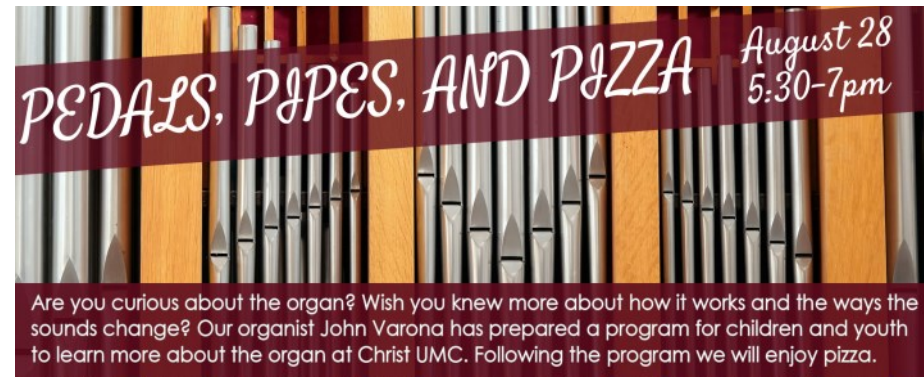

**Do You Know Your ENNEAGRAM**

The Enneagram is an ancient symbol and an ever-evolving model of nine. It diagrams, or maps nine ways of viewing the world, nine ways of how we get lost, and nine ways we find our way home. The Enneagram is a description of how holistic systems work (or don't work)! It's a diagram of how people grow in health and experience transformation and how people get trapped in pain and suffering. It's a sacred map of the territories of the soul. Jody recommends the RHETI (Riso-Hudson Enneagram Type Indicator), which you can take through The Enneagram Institute for approximately \$12 (<https://www.eneagraminstitute.com/rheti/>).
