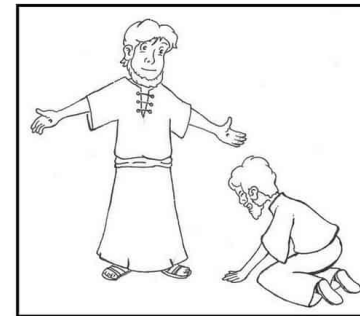

Amara Quinones lives in Puerto Rico. After hurricane Maria in 2017, many of her neighbors struggled with hunger. Amara handed out fruit trees and plants to low income families as a part of an effort called Regreen Puerto Rico. Her goal was to bring native plants back to the island while creating less dependence on imported food.
