This week, notice new things you see in creation. It might be the first dandelion of the season, a tree that has started to bud, a bird that is back from winter vacation. Each evening share them with your family.

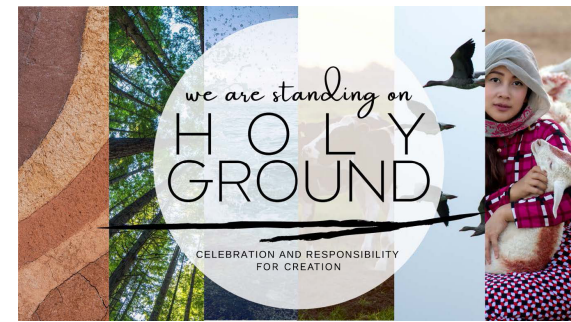

3 When I look at the heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and stars, which you have set in place,




4 What is man that you are mindful of him and the son of man that you care for him?
