

Pastor's Pen with Pastor Jenny



I spent a summer as a counselor at a United Methodist Camping and Retreat Ministry, much like the one our campers recently returned from at Northern Pines. As part of our program each week, we would create a skit based on a passage that was randomly selected from the Bible. And while I grew up going to church, it was this experience that first led me to discover stories like Baalam's talking donkey from Numbers 22 or the young Eutychus falling asleep and out of the window during Paul's sermon in Acts 20. It wasn't that these stories had been kept from me, they just weren't part of my children's story Bible or the subject of Sunday School songs. And as I continued to study the Bible in my own personal life and in seminary I went on to discover even more strange and fascinating stories that were part of scripture. Many of them were humorous, some were eerie or even a little scary. Others were hard to understand and caused me to wrestle with how they fit into my understanding of God and the Christian faith.

The Bible is made up of many genres- poetry, narratives, histories, apocalyptic literature... just to name a few. And not all of the stories or images in scripture have a neat and tidy message. In fact some are downright disturbing. But they are part of our shared history and tradition and reflect people of faith with questions about God, Jesus and God's relationship with creation. And over time I've come to embrace these strange stories as part of the legacy of our faith. In fact sometimes these quirky stories can even have surprisingly relevant and poignant insights into human life and our experience of the divine.

This summer we'll be delving into several of these strange stories of the Bible including Daniel and the Floating Hand, Eutychus' Epic Nap, Elisha and the She-Bears and more. We won't try to explain away the hard stuff or soften the rough edges, but we will consider how these stories might offer interesting perspectives to the story of our shared faith. Join us each Sunday in person or online to find out where these stories are found in scripture and how they might speak to our life today.

Hope Amidst the Suicide Crisis

In early June, Matthew Stolle wrote an article in the Post Bulletin about the hope that is present amidst the suicide crisis in southeast Minnesota. He noted that, "Mental health has been identified as a top priority for every one of the 10 counties that make up Southeastern Minnesota. The challenge stands out in Olmsted County." We have nearly twice the average rate of MN deaths by suicide and also the national average. "Mental health experts are unsure why Olmsted County's suicide rate is so high."

Zumbro Valley Mental Health has a special case worker assigned to help prevent deaths by suicide. His name is Joshua Jensen. Stolle quotes him: "We want to change the narrative around mental health, but also specifically around suicide; How can we help those who are grieving? How can we encourage people to get help and combat stigma? "

When I read this article, I knew this was something I wanted us to engage with as a church. We want to let people know that having a mental health concern is nothing to be ashamed of, nothing to be embarrassed about. There is help available. So many of us are brought up to be independent and selfreliant and the whole idea of accepting help is next to impossible, especially when we think we may be weak and /or crazy.

"Experts say there is no one single factor to explain the phenomenon of the increase in suicides."

As family members and friends, we can be alert to the signs of depression, the variations of mood, the loss of interest in others and activities. According to Olmsted County, adults with a disability, unmarried adults, and non-heterosexual adults were more prone to report suffering from depression. In addition, the suicide rate among 13 and 14 years olds nationwide doubled from 2008-2018.

The good news: in 2021 the Southeast Regional Crisis Center opened. Located at 2121 Campus Drive SE. Anyone from any of the 10 counties can walk in 24/7 and say, "I'm not doing well and I need some support." Your pastors are here to offer spiritual support. This is in Paster Mancy Whale Handler addition to the medical support you may need. We believe in the

power of medical treatment and in the power of prayer.

Evolving Faith Conference October 13 – 14, 2023 Minneapolis Convention Center


