Clear & colored glass bottles and jars (no window glass, dishware or ceramics)

Corrugated cardboard (clean only)

White office paper, Newspaper, colored paper, Magazines, Telephone and paperback books

Plastic bottles #1 and #2 (with a neck) only!
Tin food cans & Aluminum beverage cans

At the Olmsted County Recycling Center- fee for disposal

- Tires (8 or fewer)

What to do with items you no longer want?

Hazardous Waste Facility (some have a surcharge for disposal)

- Paints (you can pick up free paint here too!)
- Stains & Varnishes
- Household Cleaners
- Solvents
- Aerosols
- Pesticides
- Mercury products such as thermostats and thermometers
- Auto, rechargeable, and button batteries (free)
- Used Antifreeze
- Agricultural Pesticides (free up to 300 lbs.)
- Antifreeze
- Asbestos Containing Materials
- Cell Phones (free)
- Filters (oil, gas, transmission)
- Fluorescent Tubes
- Lead Paint Chips
- Lithium, Mercury, Silver Oxide Batteries (free)
- Metallic Mercury
- Propane Tanks



Clothing, Toys, Household Items, Books and Media

Thrift on Fifth- Accepts in season clothing for all ages as well as shoes and boots. No out of season items, household goods, etc.

CUMC hosts a rummage sale twice a year and will take your good conditioned household & clothing items

Goodwill, Salvation Army, Savers accept household and clothing items. Salvation Army will pick up! https://satruck.org/ Savers does regular pick-ups (yellow cards come in

the mail from the Epilepsy Foundation) as do the Veterans.
