Does your family have special baptism traditions?


Why are babies and adults baptized? (hint- the answer is on the other side)

Shells and Baptism

Shells have been symbols for baptism for over 800 years! Some people say John the Baptist used a scallop shell to pour water over Jesus. In our church we have a shell that has held the baptism water for many years.



"One and Done"

In the United Methodist Church, we practice both infant and adult baptism. Adults are only baptized if they were NOT baptized as an infant. In some traditions, adult baptism serves as a way to profess (or claim) your faith. We have many ways this happens, including confirmation, becoming a member of a church or "reaffirmation" of baptism.
