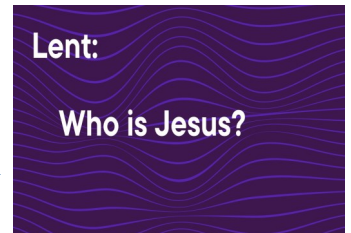
Children in Worship Children are always welcome in worship. Activity packs are available near the Sanctuary entrance.

Girl Scout Cookies for Sale Save the date! The Girl Scout Troop will be selling girl scout cookies between worship services on March 12. Cash & checks accepted.

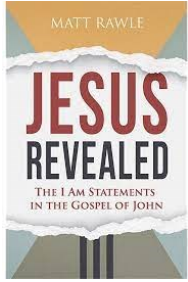
