“DO NOT JUDGE”

Worship for the next month centers on common cliches people say--often when they are trying to be helpful--that may or may not have a Biblical basis. Today's phrase is "hate the sin, love the sinner." It often comes up in conversations about LGBTQ+ inclusion.

The worship service looks at this cliché as a statement about (not) judging others as sinners. Children often have a strong sense of what is right or wrong. As parents and caregivers, we have to enforce boundaries. We can explain that we differentiate when children are "tattling" on others and when they come to us with legitimate concerns for the safety (physical and emotional) of others. This can help children learn about judging others.
