CURIOSITY AND FAITH

In worship we are exploring common cliches that may or may not have a Biblical basis. As adults, we think complexly and may find ourselves questioning what we once believed was true.

Today we close out our series with the idea that the Bible is true-- that we believe what the Bible says. As adults we know this isn't always so clear. There are many parts of the Bible we ignore, and other parts we have serious questions about.

One way to approach this with children is to remind them that Jesus is the Living Word, and can help us understand and interpret the Bible. You can ask your children, "what do you think Jesus would say about this story or passage?"

1:1-2, 3:1-8

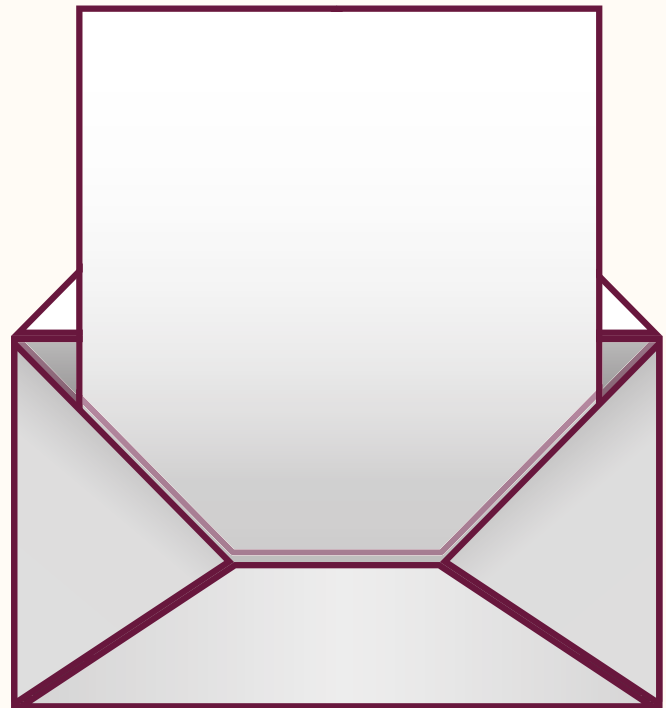


2 Timothy is a **letter** written to a young man named Timothy. It was **to help Timothy learn** what it looked like to be a **follower of the way of Jesus.**

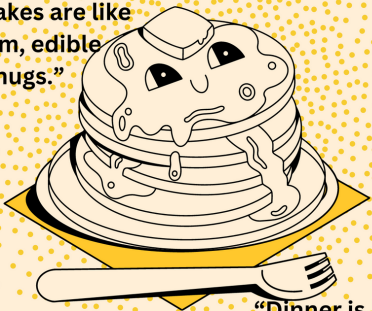
